

# TAURANGA ONCOPLASTIC BREAST COURSE 2021

## THE COURSE

The Tauranga Oncoplastic Breast Course will provide an excellent opportunity to network and gain knowledge on advanced Oncoplastic techniques with specific focus on Therapeutic Mammoplasty and Perforator Flaps. This is achieved through instructional lectures, detailed discussions, patient interaction in clinic, pre-op skin marking and attending live theatre. The program includes a visit to a Radiation Oncology centre to learn about CT planning, voluming and observe the administration of adjuvant radiotherapy. This course is specifically designed for breast fellows in New Zealand.

## COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Gain knowledge and training on advanced Oncoplastic techniques including Therapeutic Mammoplasty, Perforator Flaps and Implant Reconstruction
- Hands on experience in clinic and operating theatre with exposure to preoperative planning, skin markings and intraoperative exposure to oncoplastic techniques
- Networking, discussion and sharing of knowledge in Oncoplastic surgery
- Achieve an understanding of Radiation Oncology concepts on CT planning and administration of radiotherapy

## LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Have a thorough understanding of Therapeutic Mammoplasty and Perforator flaps including concepts, appropriate patient selection and surgical technique
- Achieve a good understanding of other advanced oncoplastic procedures through lectures and discussions
- Improved patient selection for Implant and autologous breast reconstruction

# FACULTY



## Dr Peter Chin - Convenor, Breast Surgeon

Peter Chin is a specialist breast & general surgeon at Tauranga Hospital, New Zealand. He graduated from the University of Melbourne, undertook his FRACS training in New Zealand and gained post-fellowship experience at the Edinburgh Breast Unit. Peter is on the oncoplastic subcommittee of BreastsurgANZ and is an executive director of the Australasian Society for Breast Disease. He is a passionate teacher in Oncoplastic surgery and has been actively involved in the BreastsurgANZ Level 1 and 2 Oncoplastic workshops since 2015, both as speaker and convenor. He has also contributed to the University of Sydney's Graduate Certificate/Master of Advanced Breast Surgery course. Peter is on the medical advisory committee for the NZ Breast Cancer Foundation. Peter performs a wide range of Oncoplastic procedures including Therapeutic Mammoplasty, Perforator flaps, fat grafting, Implant-based as well as autologous Lat Dorsi Flap reconstruction.



## Dr Nicola Davis - Breast Surgeon

After studying for her MBChB at Auckland Medical School, Nicola undertook her General Surgery training in New Zealand hospitals. She subsequently gained further subspecialty experience and training in Oncoplastic Breast Surgery through BreastSurgANZ with fellowship positions in Brisbane (Mater Hospital) and Canberra (Calvary Hospital and The Canberra Hospital). On her return to New Zealand, Nicola was appointed Consultant Oncologic Breast and General Surgeon at Tauranga Public Hospital. In addition to public services, Nicola consults privately at Tauranga Specialist Centre, provides specialist services through BreastScreen Bay of Plenty, and operates at Grace Hospital.



## Dr Brandon Adams - Plastic Surgeon

After completing physiology and ethics degrees, Brandon graduated from Otago University in 2003 with the Deans Prize. Brandon was awarded FRACS (Plastics) from the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. In 2012 he completed an aesthetic Fellowship in Cosmetic Surgery and in 2013 undertook a Head and Neck Reconstruction and Microsurgery Fellow in Brisbane Australia. He has published 35 peer reviewed papers on a wide range of topics. Since returning to New Zealand, Brandon has worked as in private practice and as a consultant at Waikato and Tauranga hospitals performing general plastic surgery, microsurgery, head and neck reconstruction, gender confirming surgery, breast reduction and breast reconstruction using all methods.



## Dr Jayaram Mohanamurali - Radiation Oncologist

Dr Mohanamurali is a Radiation Oncologist at the Kathleen Kilgour Centre in Tauranga. He worked as a Clinical Oncologist in the United Kingdom from 2004 until 2018, prior to moving to New Zealand. He has a special interest in Breast Cancer and Thoracic Malignancies. In addition to having been a Clinical and Educational supervisor, he was also the Undergraduate Clinical Lead for the Speciality Module including Oncology between 2010-2013 at the University of Sheffield. He was awarded the Clinical Teaching Award by the University in 2012 and 2013, for his contribution to Undergraduate Medical Teaching. He has extensive Research Experience as a Principal Investigator and Co-Investigator for a number of Clinical Trials in Oncology.
